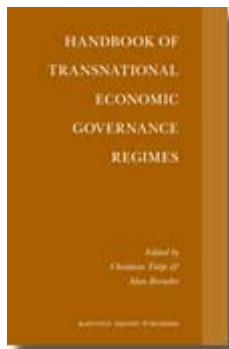


Handbook of Transnational Economic Governance Regimes
